

## Message from Rev. Nakata

What is a significance of a Black Robe?



I have good news! Finally, our family has settled in our new residence. Deliveries of a refrigerator, washer and dryer made my wife very happy. My children started school and they've already found their friends. All our family members sincerely appreciate the Sangha members who helped with our move during the very hot weather.

Beginning August 1st, I started working at the Fresno Betsuin. I've already met Jr. YBA, CCYBA, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Project Dana members and Board members at their gatherings. I look forward to meeting those who I haven't yet had a chance to meet. From this month, I will start visiting all CC temples for events and meetings. I am so excited to greet more people.

If you have a time, please stop by the Fresno Betsuin for our Fall Ohigan Seminar on Sep 7 at 9:30am. The topic is "Strategy for Growth of Nembutsu followers - Organizational Restructuring and Changing Organizational Culture." It includes Q and A session. I am a speaker. This is not an ordinary Buddhist lecture for your knowledge. I plan to present a systematic outlook for your practical action to grow our Sangha. I only use "Plain English." I really want to grow our Sangha with YOU. If you need to know more detail to decide whether you attend, please contact me.

When I attended the gatherings at the Betsuin, there were luncheons. The Betsuin has a very nice and big kitchen and the Betsuin members always keep it clean and shiny. Usually there are two white tables to serve meal in front of the kitchen. When a luncheon started, a lady came to me and said, "Reverend, please go first (to take food)." I said "I will get later. Please let other people go first." Then she said "oh, don't En-Ryo. We always let Reverend get food first." En-Ryo is a Japanese term and it means hesitate. She wanted to say "don't hesitate to get food." I love eating and there is no reason to hesitate to eat food. I just hesitate to take food as a first person. You may wonder where such my behavior come from.

When I was a novice, I studied Jodo Shinshu Buddhism at Ryukoku University in Kyoto. One of my

professors explained why priests wear a black robe. Have you seen the portraits of Shinran Shonin? He always wore a black robe. In the past, the priest rank is recognized by the colors of the robes. The black color was used for the lowest rank priest. Although he was assigned to a very high rank position while he was at Mt. Hiei, he always lived humbly. Later, he explains himself as he is like one of the gravel on a road (ref. Yui Shin Sho Mon-i). He does not think that he is superior than others. He shows his humbleness by keep wearing a black robe. In contrast, Japanese martial arts in US have unique understanding for their Black Belt. In US, when practitioners receive the black belt, normally they are recognized as a master. When I was child, I practiced Judo. When I was in 7th grade, one of my classmates received a black belt. He did not become a master. Instead, he committed to become a lifelong student of Judo by receiving his black belt. In Japan, the black belt is treated as a symbol of humbleness.

In Jodo Shinshu, wearing a black robe is to declare becoming a lifelong student for Buddhism and living humbly. Reverend is not a position above general Sangha members in our Jodo Shinshu. Reverend is a position to make sure everyone is ok. At a luncheon, I like to make sure that everyone gets food and see their smile on their face, then I get mine. It is my way of expressing humbleness as Reverend. Sincerely, Gassho.


